A9 Cromarty Bridge.

The concluding works on the A9 Cromarty Bridge, delayed as a result of the severe winter weather experienced in November and December, will recommence at 0700 hours on Monday 24th January, 2011, and finish at 1900hours on Friday 28th January 2011. The total value of the works is £800,000.

The works will involve replacing the rail joints and the plug joints. The carriageway will be reduced to a single lane with traffic signals in operation. During peak times the traffic signals will be operated manually to reduce waiting time significantly.

The work will be supervised by Scotland Transerv on behalf of Transport Scotland.

A spokesman for Scotland Transerv said;

‘This work concludes the first stage of the essential refurbishment works on the Cromarty Bridge. We are grateful to the public for their patience and we will make every effort to ensure any delays are kept to a minimum.’
