Roadworks on the A99 South Road and Francis Street Wick.

Users of the A99 Trunk Road, South Road and Francis Street, Wick, are set to benefit from a £45,000 carriageway patching scheme. The scheme is due to start on Monday 14th June 2010 and is planned to complete on Friday 18th June 2010.

The scheme extents are between the 30mph speed restriction and the traffic signals at the junction with Dempster Street over a total length of approximately 1km. The scheme will also include the application of high friction surfacing, at the northbound approach to the traffic signals.

The works, which will be carried out by Scotland Transerv on behalf of Transport Scotland, will be carried out between 0700 hours and 1900 hours, Monday to Friday. To allow the works to be carried out in safety a single lane closure will be in place controlled by traffic lights and where necessary a convoy vehicle will operate.

To minimise disruption the works will be constructed in a controlled manner, with good communication between affected parties. Supervision of the scheme will be carried out by Scotland Transerv.

Every attempt will be made to ensure that access arrangements to business premises and residential properties will, as far as possible, be maintained throughout the construction period.
