

Scotland Transerv Hosts Ministerial Visit

Stewart Stevenson MSP, the Scottish Parliament's Minister for Transport, Infrastructure and Climate Change, last month visited Broxden House, Scotland TranServ's headquarters, to meet members of the senior management team and tour the Perth office. This was an excellent opportunity to discuss the Scotland TranServ commission, including future strategy and objectives supporting the long term goals for the Scottish trunk road network.
