

## Course summary:

National Highway Sector Scheme 12C for mobile lane closure Traffic Management on motorways and other dual carriageways.

## Who should attend:

All persons who will be required by their employer to work on motorways and or high speed dual carriageways as a mobile lane closure Supervisor (Block vehicle driver). Course delegates are required to have sat and passed the 12C operative training and assessments and hold a valid 12C operative card before attending the 12C Supervisor course. Following completion of the 12C supervisor training course the learner can obtain full supervisor status (TM card) by completing a set of on and off site assessments as prescribed in the sector scheme document. The assessments must be completed within a two year period starting from the date of passing the training.

- Training and assessment requirements
- Health and safety legislation
- Reference documentation
- Vehicle and equipment specification and maintenance
- Communications roles and responsibilities
- Mobile Lane Closure principles and practical techniques.

- Understand the roles and responsibilities of Mobile Lane Closure Supervisors
- Understand the principles and practical techniques when using the Mobile Lane Closure Technique
