

Course summary:

City & Guilds Winter Service Operations is split into various units. Unit 580 is the health & safety unit which is compulsory for operatives. Following completion of this unit delegates will be required to complete at least one assessment unit using a winter service vehicle appropriate to the category being assessed.

Who should attend:

This course is aimed at those involved with Winter Operations, both existing Winter Service Operatives, who need re-assessment to re-new their registration and for new or inexperienced operatives who are seeking registration for the first time.

- Winter service vehicles and equipment.
- Rates of spread for de-icing materials.
- Emergency procedures
- Drivers hours and working time

- Winter service operational planning and monitoring
- Methods to decision making
- Qualifications available for Winter Service Operations
- Data logging

- 511 - Prepare and operate winter service vehicles up to 3500kg (Inc tractors)
- 512 - Prepare and operate winter service vehicles 3500kg to 7500kg
- 513 - Prepare and operate winter service vehicles over 7500kg Large LGV
- 550 - Operate snow blower (Rolba 400 or 1000)
- 560 - Operate snow blower - dedicated
